A message from Pastor Lisa



"We call you to exercise among us the ministry of Word and Sacrament which God has established and which the Holy Spirit empowers: To preach and teach the Word of God in accordance with the Holy Scriptures and the Lutheran Confessions; to administer Holy Baptism and Holy Communion; to lead us in worship; to proclaim the forgiveness of sins; to provide pastoral care; to speak for justice in behalf of the poor and oppressed; to encourage persons to prepare for the ministry of the Gospel' to impart knowledge of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America and its wider ministry; to endeavor to increase support given by our congregation to the work of our whole church; to equip us for witness and service; and guide us in proclaiming God's love through word and deed."

This is a direct quote from my letter of call. A letter of call is a description of what a pastor is called to do as the resident theologian and trained pastor for a congregation. What this letter of call doesn't say (none of them do) is how to go about this work. As perhaps you are seeing as we have more interns and you have seen a variety of pastors serve in ministry, that not all pastors are the same and not all pastors go about doing ministry the same. What a blessing that is to the church! For as Paul says, "The gifts he gave were that some would be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ, until all of us come to the unity of the faith and of the knowledge of the Son of God, to maturity, to the measure of the full stature of Christ." Each pastor, just as each of you have been given different gifts that they use to serve a congregation. Some pastors may feel that it is important to be an administrative leader, some may focus on Social ministry and justice issues, while another pastor may find it important to the overall health of a congregation to have a ministry strong in teaching Biblical understanding, while yet another visitation, and yet another to do ministry right along with the people. None of

these styles is better or worse than the other. Each of these styles, when over the course of a congregation's life helps to build and foster a healthy church and healthy relationships among the people of Christ.

How blessed we are here at Fredsville to witness Vicar Ron's gift with numbers and languages, and teaching, and history, and technology, and..... At the same time my personal gifts of preaching, ministering along side the people, of creativity, and leadership through times of stress and conflict which could have arisen during the past and future building projects.

In all of these gifts, it is the belief of the church that God provides us with pastors (and interns) who we need for their particular gifts at a particular time in the life of the church. It is always amazing to see how God provides us with what, maybe, we didn't even know we needed just at the right time.

There is another part of the letter of call that is just as important. "With this call, we pledge our prayers, love, esteem and personal support for the sake of the ministry entrusted to you by God and for our ministry together in Christ's name." This part means all of you. That all of you pledge your prayers, love, esteem and personal support for the sake of ministry. You see, no pastor nor intern, is called to do it all and certainly they are not called to do ministry alone. We are called to serve Christ together, side by side. All gifts are needed if all are to be served, if all are to be reached, if the kingdom is to be complete. You. You are needed. Your gifts are needed. Your prayers are needed. Your love is needed. Your support is needed.

Confirmation Students

November 2013

On October 27, eight students were confirmed through the Affirmation of Baptism service. This day was chosen as it was Reformation Sunday, the Sunday that Lutherans remember Martin Luther nailing the 95 theses to the Wittenburg Castle Door. Having the confirmation service in the fall is new to Fredsville. The change was made in hopes of taking away some of the feeling of "graduation" from church. An additional benefit of having confirmation in the fall was that Pastor Lisa was able to check with the students to see how their transition into high school was going and to encourage their continued involvement with church. It also allowed confirmation to be "special" and not be a part of the incredibly busy month of May (Mother's Day, graduations, etc.)

The students spent three years preparing for their confirmation. During their first year, the students studied the Old Testament. The New Testament was studied their second year. Last year, they studied the Lutheran Church, Martin Luther and the Small Catechism.

Fredsville Council Minutes September 29, 2013

The Meeting was called to order by President Jeff Schmidt at 7:00 pm

Members in attendance: Darla Andersen, Jacque Bakker, Doug Dall, Bev Lupkes, Pat Pruisner, Audrey Stefan, Steve Veatch, Jennifer Verhulst, Treasurer Holly Kruger, Pastor Lisa Dietrich, Vicar Ron Poe

Absent: Wendall Bergmann, Lance Loger, Ryan Petersen

A devotional reading and prayer were led by Pastor Lisa

The treasurer's report was presented by Holly Kruger. Current fund balances are: Memorial Fund \$6918.50. Endowment Fund \$98,371.66. Building Fund \$8128.32. (A separate checking account has now been set up for the building fund.) There was discussion of current cash flow issues.

The minutes of the August 25 meeting were previously approved via e-mail.

New Business

1. Pastor's health insurance. Portico Insurance is discontinuing the current policy and now has 4 levels of coverage. Their "Gold Plan" is the most similar to the current policy and the cost is \$24 per month more. A motion was made by Darla, seconded by Jacque to continue coverage with the Gold Plan. Motion carried.
2. Credit card limit. The current limit on the credit card is \$1000. Occasionally that limit has been reached and purchases need to be made on personal credit cards and then reimbursed. A motion was made by Steve, seconded by Bev to increase the credit card limit to \$3000. Motion carried. It was noted that reimbursement forms are being created to be used when members have paid for approved purchases and need to be reimbursed. Receipts will be attached to these forms which will provide Holly with the information needed, including the reason for the purchase and what monies should be used to pay for the purchase. The forms should be finalized and ready for council approval by the next meeting.
3. The church was notified by Wilma Dall's estate that she bequeathed \$50,000 to Fredsville. The money should be received by February 2014. She did not specify a particular use for the money and the constitution states that undesignated bequests be added to the unspendable principal of the Endowment Fund. Further discussion of the inheritance was tabled.

4. The Building Committee made a formal request of council that the remaining 2013 Endowment Fund distribution for capital projects be allocated to the building fund for financing Phase 3. The Endowment Committee approved the release of money pending council approval. The Endowment Committee also presented its recommendation for allocations for benevolence in categories B,C and D. A motion was made by Darla, seconded by Steve to approve the proposed disbursement. Motion carried.
5. A nominating committee consisting of Darla, Doug, Pastor Lisa and Vicar Ron was created for selecting members to run for vacancies in the Church Council.

Old Business'

1. A discussion of the length of the term of an internship was tabled at the last meeting. After further discussion, a motion was made by Bev and seconded by Doug that the standard time frame for an internship at Fredsville should be from July 15 to June 30. Motion carried.
2. Phase 3 follow-up: The building committee will be meeting for the next steps. The congregation will be notified that we are accepting contributions for the project. The next quarterly statements will include a notation of amounts the member pledged for the initial and yearly contributions.

Pastor's Report was submitted and accepted.

Intern's Report was submitted and accepted.

Committee Reports

Property Council Rep: Wendall Bergmann and Lance Loger
Lights in the sanctuary were replaced with LED lights and ceiling fan switches replaced.

Social Ministry Council Rep: Audrey Stefan and Pat Pruisner
In October and after the first of the year, offerings will be held for the Nest project. In November there will be a food drive. In December there will be celebrations for Vicar Ron and Angie's baby as well as the Angel Tree.

Christian Education Council Reps: Jennifer Verhulst
First Steps, a program for newborns through preschoolers and their parents will begin Nov. 3 from 10:30-noon and meet three times a year. 5th Quarter is a program for high school students

who meet after home football games. Attendance has been good. Addresses of college students are being collected so that care packages can be sent.

Evangelism and Stewardship, Worship and Music, Mutual Ministry, Cemetery, and Historical committees had no reports.

The next Council meeting will be October 20 at 7:00 p.m.

The meeting was adjourned at 9:00 p.m. with the Lord's Prayer.

New Business

1. Time and Talent sheets are being developed by Vicar Ron and Pastor Lisa. It was recommended they be distributed during Sunday services in November and that time should be set aside to complete them during the service. The intent is to have the information compiled to be used at the beginning of the year when organizing volunteers and committee members.

2. The nomination committee has met and is contacting people about their willingness to be nominated for the council.

Old Business

1. Phase 3: the Building Committee will meet with architect Kevin Monson tomorrow.

2. Pastor Lisa will contact the attorney representing Wilma Dall's estate to relay to the family the church's thanks for the generous bequest and to ask for clarification as to whether there was any specific intent for which the money should be used.

Pastor's Report was submitted and accepted. She requested vacation time for November 17 -30 and December 26 - January 4. She had to give up vacation time earlier this year because of unplanned conflicts so has one week and one Sunday of unused vacation time left this year. She asked to carry those days over until next year. The council approved the requests.

Intern's Report was submitted and accepted. There was no 5th Quarter student activity after the football game this week because there was an early morning cross country track meet the next day.

Committee Reports

Worship and Music Council Rep: Bev Lupkes and Darla Andersen
The committee met and made plans for the November and December services. For All Saints Sunday, in addition to honoring those who died in the past year, members of the congregation are asked to bring photos of family members who have died. These will be posted around the church so the congregation is surrounded by saints during the service.

Property Council Rep: Wendall Bergmann and Lance Loger
Their meeting was rescheduled for November 10 at 6:30 p.m.

Cemetery Council Rep: Doug Dall
Doug met with Jack Mommer who approved the idea of having additional landscaping at the site of the old church. The committee is also planning to contact the adjacent landowner about the property line.

Historical Council Rep: Steve Veatch

**ELCA World Hunger**

When Ellen was diagnosed with breast cancer, finances became overwhelming. During the time of her chemotherapy, costs began adding up. Ellen and her husband found themselves living out of their car in Colorado in order to pay for her medical expenses. Eventually they were able to find a place to stay, but the costs of treatment remained the same. They couldn't do it on their own. With the help of Project Angel Heart, supported in part by your gifts to ELCA World Hunger, Ellen and her husband were able to get back on their feet.

Project Angel Heart provided Ellen and her husband home-cooked meals and checked in to make sure she was receiving the nutrition needed while going through her treatments. Ellen says the volunteers are angels, "Come hell or high water, they come. Without these nutritious meals, I Would have never made it."

With hard work, the help of volunteers and meals, Ellen and her husband were able to get back on their feet and find a comfortable and affordable apartment which in turn allowed them the opportunity to slowly transition off of the meals that were being provided.

"I just can't express how grateful I am. No words can express it. Thank you for saving my life," says Ellen.



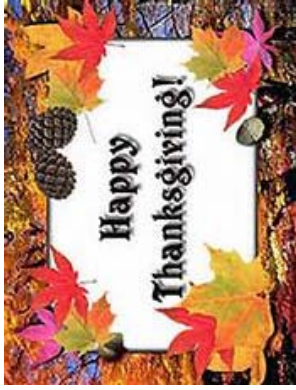
