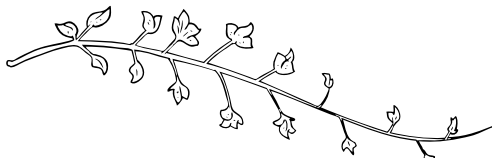

Pastoral Pondering ... Resurrection Encounter

In my vocation of pastoral ministry, I have led worship many times. I have the privilege of presiding at Holy Communion, and leading the congregation in asking God to reach down and touch us with profound Grace in the Eucharist. I have prayed the Lord's Prayer countless times with God's people. A prayer that is unifying across generations. This Easter, I felt that more profoundly than ever before as we gathered to share the Resurrection feast that brings together heaven and earth.

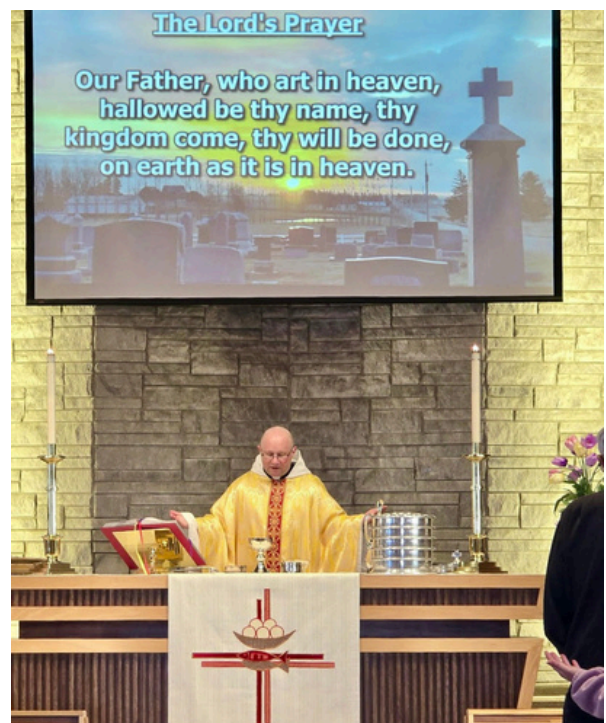
Each week, I invite the congregation to join in praying during communion. I often reach out my hands in an open posture of prayer, as if to join hands with someone standing next to me. This Easter I truly felt that I was not at the altar alone. As a Lutheran Pastor I believe in the communion of saints, the great cloud of witnesses that gather at the altar around Holy Communion. I believe in the Resurrection that makes every country church a megachurch filled with a multitude we cannot see.

At Easter as I stood praying the Lord's Prayer I felt... saw... knew... the presence of others at the altar. The presence of those who had presided at this altar in generations past. People from my family who I never met and more. A line of people holding hands extending around the altar. I felt the presence of one person come and place a hand on my shoulder... a familiar smile as they joined in. I was so moved in the moment that I almost couldn't finish the words, but I was not praying alone. Neither are you. We are held in God's Kingdom embrace, heaven and earth together in one place.

In the Resurrection of Jesus Christ we are not alone. Jesus lives. We are encountered by the Resurrection in the "Thin Places". Moments when heaven and earth touch. I believe this happens more often than we are aware. It is a gift of Grace. A moment that I hope I will not soon forget. The Resurrection is an encounter with the divine in the thin places of life. I hope that you will experience the Love of God that is given and present for you and with you in Jesus Christ.

Graduating Seniors

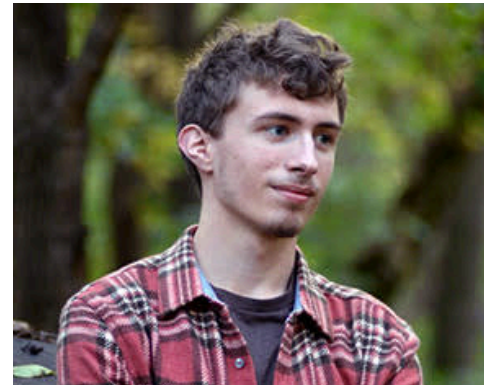

Call to Order: President Amy Camarata called the meeting to order.

Devotions: Pastor opened with a devotional response exercise, “How many people go to your church?”, focusing on how we can respond with what is more important in the church (rather the number attendees) and followed with a prayer.

Treasurer’s Report: Linda Nielsen presented the financials and reviewed the year-to-date Profit and Loss by General Fund compared to the year-to-date prior year.

As of March 31, 2026

- General Fund: \$63,503.14
- Building Fund: \$55,554.54
- Memorial Fund: \$15,252.06

Secretary’s Report:

- Previously reviewed and approved by Council via email.

Old Business Discussed:

- None

New Business Discussed:

- Tech Committee brought to Amy’s attention there is still a need for more volunteers. Looking specifically for people to help click the slides during worship. Also presented to Amy was the suggestion to ask Ashley if she would have interest in recording and editing the worship video. Pastor will reach out to Ashley.
- Council reviewed the Endowment committee’s 2026 allocations of funds. Organizations considered for funding must apply in order to receive funds. Endowment committee then reviews applications and designates funding. Council had no concerns of the committee’s allocations.

Updates and Upcoming Reminders:

- Lawn care was briefly discussed; the grounds have been mowed twice. All who noticed it said the lawn looked great.
- No storm damage was noted from the recent hailstorm. All is good with solar panels.

Pastor Report: A full Pastor's report is available as an attachment in the Secretary's Notebook.

- Holy Week was very busy, well attended and very rewarding. Good Friday service at Fredsville had many people that were deeply moved.
- Graduation is quickly approaching and there will be a Graduate Blessing on May 3rd at Fredsville. Pastor is also working with our partners at the Reformed Church of Stout for the DNH Baccalaureate, to be held on May 13th.
- Continued pastoral care through services at Westview Estates in Reinbeck, home/phone call/hospital visits. Do not hesitate to let Pastor know of your pastoral care needs.
- Confirmation had their final two class sessions for the season, and a Wrap-up Party is planned for April 29th at 6:30. All congregation members are invited to attend. Tuesday Bible study continues but will be temporarily moved to Fredsville's Fellowship Hall.
- Continued involvement with various meetings, conferences and events with this past month attending the UNI PTSD Awareness and Suicide Prevention Conference and the Institute of Liturgical Studies at Valparaiso University.
- Fredsville Digital Ministry continues to increase; we are gaining attention to Facebook posts, live streaming worship videos and visitors have seen us online and then decided to attend in person.
- Aebleskiver was a successful event, with over 330 people attending.

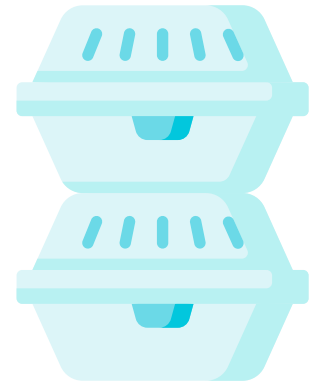
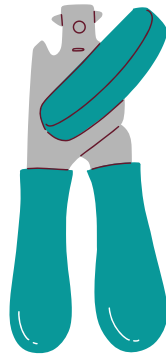

In today's gospel Jesus prays for his followers and for their mission in his name. Amid religious, social, and economic divisions, we seek the unity that Jesus had with his Father. Made one in baptism, we go forth to live our faith in the world, eager for the unity that God intends for the whole human family.

Prayer of the Day

O God of glory, your Son Jesus Christ suffered for us and ascended to your right hand. Unite us with Christ and each other in suffering and in joy, that all the world may be drawn into your bountiful presence, through Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

Red

Pentecost derives its name from the Jewish festival celebrating the harvest and the giving of the law on Mount Sinai fifty days after Passover. Fifty days after Easter, we celebrate the Holy Spirit as God's presence within and among us. In Acts the Spirit arrives in rushing wind and flame, bringing God's presence to all people. Paul reminds us that though we each have different capacities, we are unified in the Spirit that equips us with these gifts. Jesus breathes the Holy Spirit on his disciples, empowering them to forgive sin. We celebrate that we too are given the breath of the Holy Spirit and sent out to proclaim God's redeeming love to all the world.

Prayer of the Day

O God, on this day you open the hearts of your faithful people by sending into us your Holy Spirit. Direct us by the light of that Spirit, that we may have a right judgment in all things and rejoice at all times in your peace, through Jesus Christ, your Son and our Lord, who lives and reigns with you and the Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

Amen.

Though the word trinity is not found in the scriptures, today's second reading includes the apostolic greeting that begins the liturgy: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all. In the gospel Jesus sends his disciples forth to baptize in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. More than a doctrine, the Trinity expresses the heart of our faith: we have experienced the God of creation made known in Jesus Christ and with us always through the Holy Spirit. We celebrate the mystery of the Holy Trinity in word and sacrament, as we profess the creed, and as we are sent into the world to bear witness to our faith..

Prayer of the Day

Almighty Creator and ever-living God: we worship your glory, eternal Three-in-One, and we praise your power, majestic One-in-Three. Keep us steadfast in this faith, defend us in all adversity, and bring us at last into your presence, where you live in endless joy and love, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit, one God, now and forever.

God continues to be made known in those on the margins of society, like Matthew the tax collector and the hemorrhaging woman. As we gather each Lord's day we receive the healing that makes us well and sends us forth to be signs of God's mercy for the world.

Prayer of the Day

O God, you are the source of life and the ground of our being. By the power of your Spirit bring healing to this wounded world, and raise us to the new life of your Son, Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord.
